Vandalism (n) - The act of intentionally damaging public or private property.

There is a lot of vandalism in my neighbourhood due to youths with nothing better to do.

Drink-driving (n) - the act of driving a vehicle after drinking too much alcohol.

Drink-driving has caused a number of deaths in my country.

Capital punishment (n) - punishment by death, as ordered by a legal system.

I personally do not agree that capital punishment should be used for dangerous criminals.

Corporal punishment (n) - the punishment of people, especially children, by hitting them.

Corporal punishment used to be common in school but it's not an option nowadays.

Detention (n) - The punishment of being forced to stay in school after class ends.

Prison sentence (n) - The punishment of being forced to spend a period in prison.

The criminal received a prison sentence of 5 years for his crime.

Terrorism (n) - violent action for political purposes.

Petty crime (n) - crime that is not considered serious compared with some other crimes.
